The Chair introduced Josie O'Heney, NGA Clinical Fellow, who presented the editorial changes on the use of CTG.

5. Afternoon presentations

The Chair introduced Agnesa Mehmeti, Systematic Reviewer and Paul Jacklin, Senior Health Economist, who presented the clinical evidence review for IPC Q1.1: What are the benefits and risks of different places of birth for women at different BMI thresholds?, and discussed the potential for health economic analysis.

The chair introduced Claire Maynard, Systematic Reviewer, who presented the clinical evidence review for IPC Q8.2: Is intravenous administration of oxytocin more effective than intramuscular administration in the active management of the third stage of labour?

The committee revised and signed off the protocol for IPC Q8.1

The committee discussed and reviewed the proposed editorial changes to the CTG recommendations, agreed to some and made revisions to others.

The committee discussed the evidence for IPC Q1.1 and drafted recommendations.
